

# MIDNIGHT SKY

Finished Quilt Size: 94" x 94"

Finished Block Size: 15" x 15"



## Yardage Requirements:

fabric #1: 1 7/8 yards

fabric #2: 1 1/2 yards

fabric #3: 2 yards

fabric #4: 1 7/8 yards

fabric #5: 7/8 yards

fabric #6: 2/18 yards

backing fabric: 9 yards

## Cutting:

(All strips are cut across the width of the fabric from selvage edge to selvage edge.)

Fabric #1 & #2 are used for pinwheel blocks.

Fabrics #2 & #3 are used for diamond blocks.



### From fabric #1 cut:

(8) 5 7/8" strips. Cut (7) 5 7/8" x 5 7/8" squares from each strip. (4) squares are extra.

(2) 5 1/2" strips. Cut (7) 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" squares from each strip. (1) square is extra.

### From fabric #2 cut:

(8) 5 7/8" strips. Cut (7) 5 7/8" x 5 7/8" squares from each strip. (4) squares are extra.

### From fabric #3 cut:

(4) 5 7/8" strips. Cut (6) 5 7/8" x 5 7/8" squares from each strip.

(7) 5 1/2" strips. Cut (7) 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" squares from each strip. Once square is extra.

### From fabric #4 cut:

(4) 5 7/8" strips. Cut (6) 5 7/8" x 5 7/8" squares from each strip.

(2) 5 1/2" strips. Cut (6) 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" squares from each strip.

(10) 2 1/4" strips for the binding.

### From fabric #5 cut:

(8) 3" strips from the inner border.

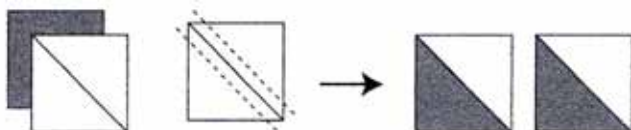
### From fabric #6:

(9) 7 1/2" strips.

## Sewing

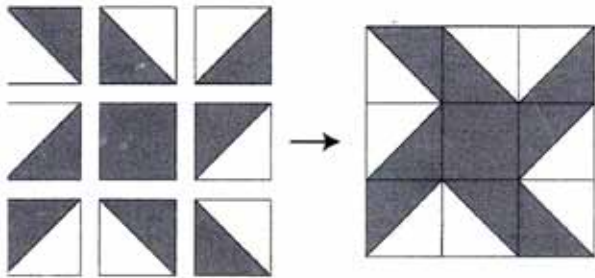
(All seams are sewn with a 1/4" seam allowance.)

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of one 5 7/8" square from fabric 1 or 2. Right sides together, layer the marked square with a 5 7/8" the remaining square. Sew 1/4" away on both sides of the marked line. Cut the unit apart on the marked line to make two pieced squares. Press both seams toward the darker print triangles. Repeat to make a total of eight pieced squares.



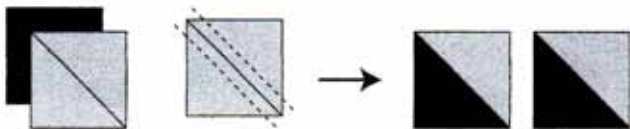
## Sewing Continued...

2. Sew a 5 1/2" square from fabric #1 and the pieced squares from step 1 together as shown to make one pinwheel block.

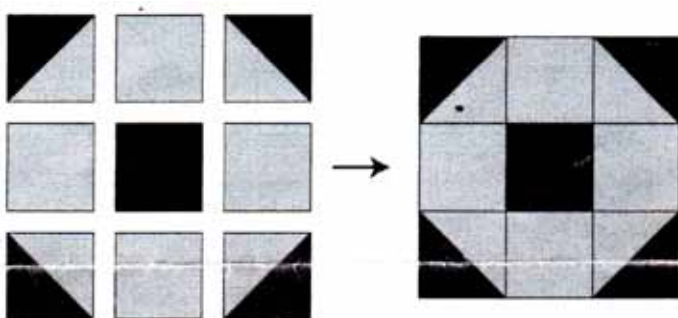


3. Repeat steps 1 and 2 to make a total of thirteen pinwheel blocks.

4. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of one 5 7/8" fabric #3 or #4 square. Right sides together, layer the marked square with a 5 7/8" remaining square. Sew 1/4" away on both sides of the marked line. Cut the unit apart on the marked line to make two pieced squares. Press all seams toward the darker fabric triangles. Repeat to make a total of four pieced squares.



5. Sew a 5 1/2" fabric #4 square, four 5 1/2" fabric #5 squares, and the four pieced squares from step four together as shown to make one block.



6. Repeat steps 4 and 5 to make a total of twelve blocks.

## Quilt Assembly and Finishing

1. Referring to the block pictured at the beginning, assemble five rows of five blocks each. Alternate the pinwheel and diamond blocks exactly as shown. Sew the rows of blocks together to complete the body of the quilt top.

2. Trim the selvages from the 3" fabric #5 inner border. Sew the strips together end to end to make one long 3" strip. From this long strip, cut two pieces 3" x 75 1/2" and two pieces 3" x 80 1/2" (if your measurements are different, cut to fit your quilt top). Sew one shorter piece to the right and left-hand sides of the quilt top. Sew one longer piece to the top and bottom of the quilt top. Press all seams toward the inner border strips.

3. Trim the selvages from the 7 1/2" outer border strips. Sew the strips together end to end to make one long 7 1/2" strip. From this long strip, cut two pieces 7 1/2" x 80 1/2" and two pieces 7 1/2" x 94 1/2" (if your measurements are different, cut to fit your quilt top). Sew one shorter piece to the right and left-hand sides of the quilt top. Sew one longer piece to the top and bottom of the quilt top. Press all seams toward the outer border strips.

4. Layer the completed quilt with batting and backing and quilt as desired.

5. Bind the finished quilt using the 2 1/4" fabric #4 strips.
